A few things surfaced as I moved the UBA2 from v18 to v19. I'm hoping the act of documenting them here will help others as well as maybe provide some feedback to the OOTP

All and all, I'm thrilled with v19, but as in all endeavors, nothing is perfect... but sometimes, it doesn't have to be.

STAR RATINGS

The first things I noticed after the transfer was that all the ballplayers lost Stars - on average about 2 levels.

I had gotten use to the old system as 3-Star players were average, 1-Star were terrible, and 5-Star players were great.

The new system feels this way... 1-Star are average, 3-Star are Great, and 5-Star (if you have any) are Legendary. I've got exactly TWO 5-Star players and FOUR 41/2-Star players in a league of 300 ballplayers.
