"I've got a long road ahead of me. At this point, I'm just taking it one day at a time."

The Knickerbockers had lost 8 players to retirement, 6 of which were second tier, but also signed CF Aaron Blair who had just won Rookie of the Month in May. Having lost the Cup last year by only one game, the Knicks were in a decent position to improve their odds.

The Pastime Club and the Beaneaters were involved in an October trade that was considered favorable to both teams, so an improvement to one or both was certainly possible. Henry expected an exciting season.






Randy Fein Crowned Top UBA II Hitter in May: Knickerbockers






Alex Teniente Chosen UBA II Batter of the Month: Bridegrooms

Teniente on the season is hitting .358 with 3 home runs. His stats include 27 RBIs and 27 runs scored.




Pat Shafer Named Pitcher of the Month in June: Bridgrooms

To date this season, Shafer has registered 11 starts, 7-4 won-lost mark, 2.02 ERA, 98 IP, 35 strikeouts and 16 walks. Opposing teams have hit .230 against him.
