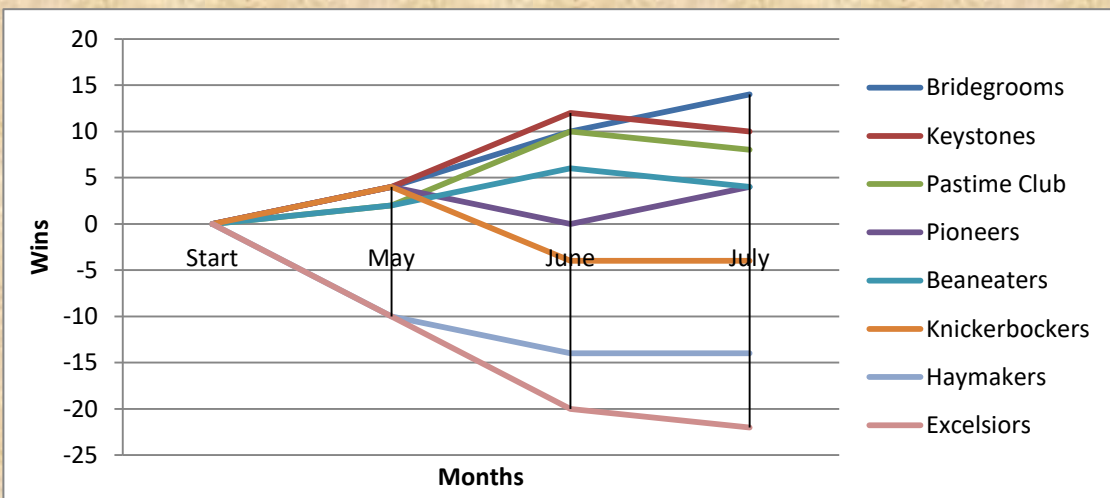

The top UBA Reimagined rookie in 1902 was center fielder Sam McCrary. He's the latest winner of the UBA Reimagined Rookie of the Year Award.

During his first year in the league, the 27-year-old McCrary hit .300 with 127 hits, no home runs, 38 RBIs and 65 runs scored. He also walked 27

times on his way to a .346 on-base percentage.

He received 5 first place votes out of a possible 8. Aaron Blair of the Knickerbockers finished second in voting with 1 first place vote, while Miguel Flores of the Bridegrooms * finished third with 2 first place votes.

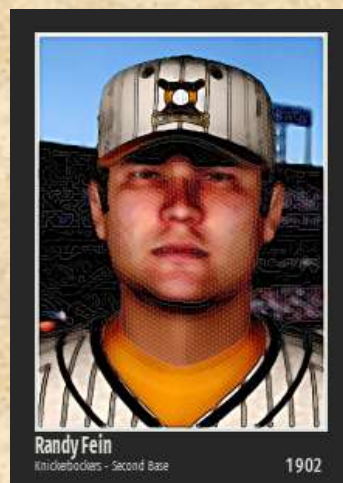

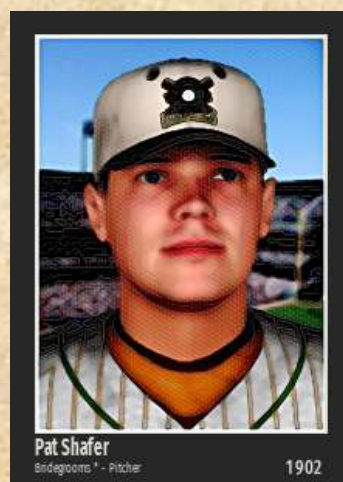


Fein Top Hitter in UBA II in July:

Presently Fein is batting .332 with 92 hits and 4 home runs. He has knocked in 50 runs and scored 40 times.

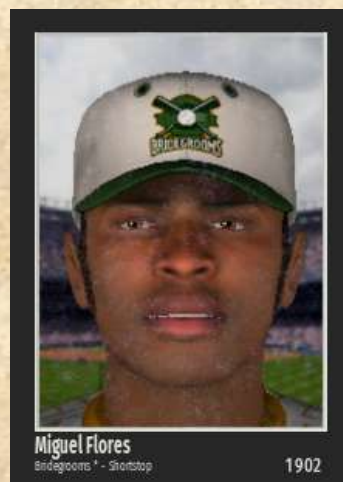


Shafer Wins UBA II Top Pitcher Honors:

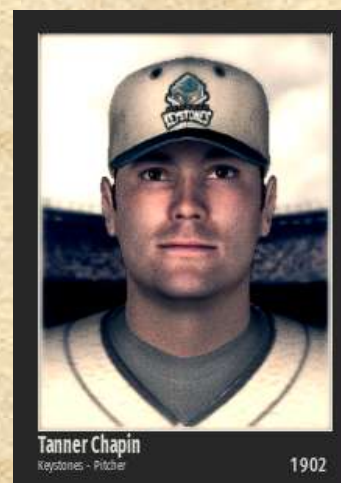
UBA II Honors Searle, #1 Batter in August:
