






Fein Top Hitter in UBA II in July:

Presently Fein is batting .332 with 92 hits and 4 home runs. He has knocked in 50 runs and scored 40 times.




Shafer Wins UBA II Top Pitcher Honors:

This year Flores is batting .331 with 2 home runs and 27 RBIs. In 43 games he has scored 28 times.




UBA II Honors Searle, #1 Batter in August:

Lifetime Searle is batting .285 with 21 doubles, 3 triples, 4 home runs and 57 RBIs in 116 games.




Chapin Wins UBA II Top Pitcher Honors:


