Deep Is EPL Swing King: The number-one ranked hitter in the Erie-Pacific League for 1947 is Norm Deep.

The Emery Park Vikings right fielder won the league batting crown with 193 hits in 523 at-bats. No one in the league had a higher average.

Deep played in 145 games and finished his standout season with 19 home runs, 101 RBIs and scored 114 times.

1947 EPL #1 Star is Emery Park's Deep: The manager of the Emery Park Vikings said he thinks Norm Deep is only going to get better as he gets older.

He may only be 26, but it will be hard to top the right fielder's 1947 campaign, as he has been named the winner of the Erie-Pacific League Most Valuable Player Award.

His winning campaign featured a .369 batting average and a .513 on-base percentage this year. In 145 games he piled up 193 hits, 36 doubles, 7 triples, 19 home runs, 101 RBIs and 114 runs scored.

Andy Haumesser of the Fulton Saints finished second in voting, while Curtis Birdwell of the Lakeshore Cardinals finished third.

Best Pitcher Honor Goes to Birdwell of Lakeshore: The Pitcher of the Year Award for 1947 has been presented and the Erie-Pacific League winner is Curtis Birdwell of Lakeshore.

"It's always nice to receive an award like this," said Birdwell. "I just hope I can improve on my performance next year and be in the running again," the Cardinals star told reporters.

Birdwell excelled with an impressive 20-9 record in 34 starts. In 275 innings he yielded 223 hits and 72 walks, while striking out 120 and compiling a fine 2.13 ERA.

Steve Elbers of the Murray Hill Stallions finished second in voting, while Christian McLean of the Emery Park Vikings finished third.

Puello This Year's Top Rookie: The regular season is now history and it's awards time in the Erie-Pacific League. This year's winner of the Rookie of the Year Award is 24-year-old Wilson Puello of the Lakeshore Cardinals.

The talented catcher batted .258, played in 126 games and delivered 112 hits in 434 at-bats. His totals also included 7 home runs, 66 RBIs, 46 runs scored, 70 walks and a .357 OPB.
