GLBL News: Draft Pool Revealed: The speculation as to who will be the number one pick can now officially begin. EASTERN LEAGUE MAY AWARDS

Toronto's Miller Snags May Batting Title:

Joe Miller received the Eastern League Batter of the Month trophy earlier today for his efforts at the plate this last month. "He might be getting older," Toronto's manager told reporters, "But he's been

around long enough to know what it takes to put a stretch such as this together... and he doesn't keep that to himself. He's always talking to the younger guys in the clubhouse helping 'em any way they'll let him. Joe's value to our team goes farther than the numbers he puts up on the field." To win the honor Miller put up a .310 batting average, 2 home runs, 15 RBIs and scored 11 times in May.

May's Best Starter Named in EL:

Duane Sato's been around the league long enough to appreciate the honor he received today. After going 6-0 in May, the 28-year-old Rochester hurler has been named Eastern League Pitcher of the Month. He fanned 22 in 63 innings, logged an ERA of 0.43 and allowed opponents to hit .220 against him.

Eastern League Names Rookie of Month:

A veritable toddler to the Eastern League, William Spittal just sewed up the Rookie of the Month trophy for May. Over the past month the 25-year-old center fielder for Buffalo hit .296 with 24 hits, no home runs and 12 runs batted in. He also logged 6 walks and compiled a .352 on-base percentage.

WESTERN LEAGUE MAY AWARDS

Jordan Takes WL's Best Bat Trophy:

Seasoned by several years of professional experience, 30-year-old Roger Jordan put together a solid offensive month for Kalamazoo and was crowned May's top batter in the Western League. He batted .412 with 4 home runs, 20 RBIs and 20 runs scored.

Pitcher of the Month Named in WL:

Edward Jenkins hasn't been around the big leagues long enough to know that youngsters shouldn't be winning Western League Pitcher of the Month. But when you put up numbers like his, you're going to get some notice. In May the Kalamazoo starter earned a 4-2 mark in 6 starts. He threw 68 innings, struck out 16 and compiled a solid 2.38 ERA.

WL Selects Rookie Star of the Month:







Youngster Javier León emerged as the latest Western League Rookie of the Month today. The young man from Chicago deserved the honor, batting .319 with 1 home run and 10 runs batted in. Is the month of May a harbinger of things to come or just a fluke? We'll find out someday, but for now, we'll just let León enjoy the limelight.

EASTERN LEAGUE JUNE AWARDS

EL Best Hitter Award to Cleveland's Rickey Cox:

When Rickey Cox stepped up to the plate in June, he did it with confidence and today he was honored with the Eastern League Batter of the Month award. The young Cleveland first baseman posted a .455 batting average with 2 home runs, 17 RBIs and scored 9 runs. Cox also worked pitchers for 18 walks to post a .542 on-base percentage. Thus far this year Cox has hit .368 with 2 home runs and 24 RBIs.

June's Top Starter is Martin:

No doubt about it! Hamilton starter Lee Martin earned his Eastern League Pitcher of the Month award. He made that very clear as he mowed his way through league hitters in June. During the month Martin chalked up a 6-1 record with a 2.82 ERA. The Cardinals star made 6 starts and surrendered 56 hits in 54.1 innings. He struck out 18 and walked 16. Martin has started 11 times this year, pitched 94.2 innings, fanned 23 batters and walked 31. His current record is 8 wins and 4 losses with a 3.52 ERA.

EL Names Martin Best Rookie:

William Martin of the Rochester Patriots has been voted the top Rookie in the Eastern League. In June he collected 20 hits, 1 home run, 15 RBIs and 7 runs scored. He batted .313 with a .353 OBP. To date,

Martin has collected 33 hits for a .330 average. He has posted 1 home run, scored 9 runs and driven in 19 runs.

WESTERN LEAGUE JUNE AWARDS

WL Best Hitter Trophy Goes to García:

The hard-hitting right fielder from Toledo, Sonny García, wielded a big bat in June and was hailed as the Western League Batter of the Month. He hit a healthy .359 with 1 home run, 19 RBIs and 18 runs scored. So far this season, García has recorded a .299 batting average with 59 hits, 1 home run, 35 RBIs, 34 runs scored and a .365 OBP.

Myers Is June's Best WL Hurler:

Despite the number of years he's been in the league, Sam Myers still gets excited when he puts together a quality stretch like he had in June. The 36-year-old starter for Kalamazoo was named Western League Pitcher of the Month earlier today. He collected 5 wins and 2 losses with 29 strikeouts in his 7 starts, putting up a fine 2.36 ERA in 61 innings of work. To date this season Myers has compiled a 8-4 record with a 2.86 ERA in 12 starts.

WL Names Kalamazoo's Boyer Top Rookie:







Freddie Boyer's eyes seem to light up whenever he sees the baseball. The young Kalamazoo second baseman has been hitting everything in sight for the better part of a month. In June he was voted the Rookie of the Month Award. During the month he hit .269 with 4 doubles, 1 triple and 2 home runs. Boyer also scored 15 times and drove in 17 runs. In 46 games this year Boyer has posted a .282 average and put up these numbers: 2 home runs, 29 RBIs and 27 runs scored.

Alfonso Carbajal (DET) broke Joe Miller's previous hitting streak with a 14 game run, but then fell to Harry Hayes (HAM) 15 games streak days later.

Fitzpatrick Hits for the Cycle: It was a special day for Jacob Fitzpatrick at Ballpark of Detroit. Not only did Terriers beat the Detroit Stars 8-3, but the Toledo left fielder hit for the cycle, too. The 27-year-old Fitzpatrick racked up 1 single, 1 double, 1 triple and 1 home run to get his name mentioned in the record book. For the game he was 4-5 with 1 RBI and 3 runs scored. In the words of the Detroit manager, "He hit everything we threw. There was just no getting him out today." Speaking to the press after the game, Fitzpatrick said, "First pitch fastballs, that's what I was looking for today... I got some good looks." Jacob Fitzpatrick singled in the 1st, flied out in the 2nd, tripled in the 5th, doubled in the 7th and hit a solo-shot off Víctor Perales in the 9th. In his stats this season, Fitzpatrick has posted a batting average of .307 with 43 hits in 140 at-bats, 1 home run and 24 RBIs. He has also scored 28 runs, walked 10 times and compiled a .351 OBP.

EASTERN LEAGUE JULY AWARDS

Rochester Right Fielder EL's Best Batter in July:

David Gordon battered Eastern League pitchers all July and wound up taking home the Batter of the Month Award. "I've been around Great Lakes Baseball League long enough to know you really have to work hard day in and day out to be able to put up this kind of consistency," the 29-year-old Gordon told reporters. "I put in a lot of work, even on the days I might not take the field, and it's always nice when everything comes together for me like it did this last month." In 24 games, Gordon hit .385 with 1 home run, 21 RBIs and scored 22 runs. This season Gordon is batting .311 with 85 hits, 2 home runs, 40 RBIs, 42 walks, .403 OBP and has scored 56 runs. He has played in 72 games.

Eastern League Announces Top Starter:

The Eastern League made it official today -- Greg Lewis of the Syracuse Spartans is the Pitcher of the Month. In July he impressed the sportswriters with his domination of league hitters. Lewis made 6 starts, registered 5 wins and 1 loss with a solid 1.77 ERA. In 56 innings he allowed 57 hits, racked up 20 strikeouts, walked 5 and permitted teams to hit .248 against him. In 18 starts this season Lewis has compiled a 12-6 record and a 2.16 ERA.

Rochester First Baseman Rated Best Rookie:

William Martin certainly had a lot to crow about in the Eastern League in July. The rookie first baseman for Rochester tagged opposing pitchers for a .326 batting average and was the top votegetter for the Rookie of the Month trophy. He won it by going 29-89 in 23 games with 2 home runs, 16 RBIs and 15 runs scored. Currently Martin is batting .328 with 3 home runs and 35 RBIs.

WESTERN LEAGUE JULY AWARDS

WL's Best Batter Selected: The vote is in and Eduardo Gómez, the 27-year-old catcher for Milwaukee, is the winner. Today he was honored with the Western League Batter of the Month award. In July, Gómez wowed voters with a .389 average while posting up 2 home runs, 14 RBIs, 16 runs scored and a .423 on-base percentage. This year Gómez is hitting at a .332 pace with 5 home runs and 36 RBIs. He has played in 67 games and scored 41 times.

WL Selects Jackson July's Top Starter:

Veteran Kenny Jackson put together quite a successful stretch in July for the Grand Rapids Wolves, earning himself the Western League Pitcher of the Month award. Jackson racked up a 5-1 record in 6 starts, posting a 1.70 ERA over 53 innings and striking out 19. This season Jackson has a 10-4 record with a 2.39 ERA in 15 starts.

WL Best Newcomer Trophy Awarded:







Harold Brown earned July's Rookie of the Month honors in the Western League for last month's performance. The boyish Detroit left fielder might be wet behind the ears, but he's proving that he has what it takes to play at this level. Brown hit .381 with no home runs, 18 RBIs and 11 runs scored this past month on his way to winning the award. This season Brown has hit at a .331 clip and produced 32 runs batted in, no home runs and 19 runs.

Taylor's Hit Streak Reaches 20 Games:

Today at Clippers Ballpark Hamilton lost to Rochester 2-0, but Blake Taylor kept his consecutive-game hitting streak alive with 1 hit. The Cardinals first baseman has now delivered hits in 20 straight games. Blake Taylor singled in the 1st, flied out in the 4th, walked in the 7th and grounded out in the 9th. For the year Taylor has hit at a .323 clip with 35 RBIs, 3 home runs and 39 runs scored.

August's Best EL Hitter is Blake Taylor: When guys like Hamilton's Blake Taylor win Batter of the Month awards, it just makes you feel good. In a productive August, the longtime Eastern League veteran toyed with opposing pitchers all month long, collecting 45 hits in 112 at-bats. The veteran first baseman hit for a .402 batting average and collected 2 home runs, 23 RBIs and 16 runs scored. Taylor is hitting .345 this year with 5 home runs, 58 RBIs and 55 runs scored.
